
Newly Elected Officers



Despite miraculous advancements in medicine, there is no substitute for human blood. The need for blood is great—nationally, someone needs blood every two seconds. And, while 38% of the population is medically eligible, only 5% donate blood.

We've partnered with LifeSource to help increase the number of blood donors from DuPage County. LifeSource, Chicagoland's Blood Center, is a non-profit organization that provides blood products to Level I trauma centers of 60 hospitals in the Chicagoland area.

As a blood donor, you'll a free mini-physical including blood pressure, temperature, pulse, and hemoglobin level *plus* a FREE cholesterol screening and FREE blood typing! And, Post 2164 is offering all donors the chance to win a \$25 Visa Gift Card.

Birth certificate along with a picture ID that includes the donor's full name will also be accepted.

Buddy Poppy Campaign

Since 1922, the Buddy Poppy has been an integral part of the VFW community. As VFW's official memorial flower, the Poppy represents the bloodshed of American service members. It reiterates that the VFW will not forget their sacrifices.



The Poppy movement was inspired by Canadian Army Col. John McCrae's famous poem, "In Flanders Fields." Poppies were originally distributed by the Franco-American Children's League to benefit children in the devastated areas of France and Belgium following WWI.
